## Short Summary

According to CHR (10 February 12, 12 April 11, and 16 May 12), AP, via Star Tribune (10 February 12), RFA (17 January 12), CAA (10 February 12 and 14 February 12), and the NYT (17 January 12), PSB officials in Hangzhou city, Zhejiang province, detained democracy activist Zhu Yufu on March 5, 2011, and formally arrested him on April 11 on suspicion of "inciting subversion of state power." The Hangzhou Municipal Intermediate People's Court sentenced him to 7 years in prison on February 10, 2012. Zhu's sentencing document cited as evidence his writings and activities in the name of the China Democracy Party (CDP); his fundraising activities for democracy advocates; statements and articles he wrote with "rumors" posted overseas that "incited hostility" towards and "slandered our country's" state power; and three Internet postings, including a poem, that "incited" people to "subvert state power" around the time of online calls for "Jasmine" protest rallies. Zhu lost his appeal on May 7, 2012, and was transferred to Zhejiang Provincial No. 4 Prison on May 10. Previously, authorities sentenced him to 7 years' imprisonment in 1999 for promoting democracy, and to 2 years in 2007.
