Short Summary

According to SMHRIC, state security officials in Hohhot, Inner Mongolia Autonomous Region (IMAR), detained an ethnic Mongol man, Almas (Almas Sharnuud, Almas Sharnud), of Naiman Banner, Tongliao city, IMAR, on April 30, 2009, while officials detained another ethnic Mongol man, Baoyu, in Bogt city on the same day. SMHRIC reported that authorities detained them for involvement or alleged involvement in the "Pan-Mongolia Democratic Association," which authorities label as separatist, as well as for alleged attempts to arrange a protest in Hohhot. Authorities reportedly released Baoyu but held Almas at multiple locations in the IMAR for three months before placing him under "house arrest" (home confinement) for one year. According to SMHRIC, authorities placed Almas under "house arrest" again in late May 2011, amid peaceful protests that took place throughout the region between May 23 and May 31. According to SMHRIC, Almas went "missing" on May 31, 2011. No additional information on his status is available.
