Short Summary

According to Chinese Human Rights Defenders ([25 February 11](#)), police in Harbin city, Heilongjiang province, took Liang Haiyi (pen name Miaoxiao) in for questioning on February 19, 2011. Authorities detained Liang's ex-husband but later released him. Liang reportedly remained in custody. On February 21, authorities criminally detained Liang on suspicion of "subversion of state power." They accused her of "posting information from foreign Web sites regarding the 'Jasmine Revolution' actions on domestic Web sites" including QQ, a popular microblogging site. The [Jasmine Revolution](#) is an anonymous, apparently non-violent call for regular protests in China starting in late February. Liang's lawyer reportedly said that Liang had reposted others' writing but had not written anything herself. Liang is currently being held at the Harbin City No. 2 Detention Center.
