Short Summary

According to CHRD ([February 25, 2011](#); [March 31, 2011](#); [29 April 11](#), [14 May 11](#), and [14 July 11](#), via Blogspot), CAA ([17 October 11](#)), AI ([9 September 11](#)), HRIC ([25 February 11](#)), and RFA ([6 September 11](#)), PSB officers in Mianyang city, Sichuan province, criminally detained democracy advocate Ding Mao on February 19, 2011, on suspicion of "inciting subversion of state power" and formally arrested him on the same charge on March 28. The Mianyang procuratorate transferred the case back to PSB officials for further investigation twice for the lack of evidence, once in May and again in September. In February, Ding reportedly had forwarded, via microblog, messages about "Jasmine" protests. He is reportedly in the Mianyang city PSB detention center. Mianyang officials have not permitted Ding's wife to visit him and as of October, had not responded to her August request to "modify his compulsory measures," e.g. to "residential surveillance," or to "released on bail pending trial." Officials prevented Ding's lawyer from visiting him until August 11, 2011. Previously, authorities imprisoned Ding in 1989 and 1992 for about eight years total for his democracy activism.
