Short Summary

According to the New York Times ([11 March 11](#)), human rights lawyer Li Tiantian is believed to have been detained in late February or early March 2011, but her whereabouts are unknown. The detention is in apparent connection to official concerns over political unrest in the Middle East and North Africa and to an anonymous online call for protests in Chinese cities. According to Chinese Human Rights Defenders ([2 February 11](#)), on January 24, 2011, domestic security protection officials harassed Li after detaining human rights activists [Feng Zhenghu](#), Lu YINUO, and Shen Zhaohua at a social gathering. According to Radio Free Asia ([22 July 10](#)), Shanghai authorities removed blogs of prominent rights advocates, including Li's blog, in 2010.
