Short Summary

According to a letter from pastor Wang Shuangyan of the Beijing-based unregistered New Tree Church reprinted via the ChinaAid Association ([3 May 11](#), in Chinese; [5 May 11](#), in English), on May 1, 2011, public security officials in Beijing municipality detained Wang as she participated in an outdoor worship gathering organized by the Beijing-based unregistered Beijing Shouwang Church. Sources do not indicate where officials held Wang. The officials reportedly told Wang that "[a]ll the churches not recognized by the government are illegal gatherings" and cited "suspicion of engaging in illegal gatherings" as the reason for her detention. Officials reportedly interrogated Wang about the activities, finances, members, and registration status of the New Tree Church and warned her not to participate in Shouwang's outdoor gatherings or associate with Shouwang. Officials reportedly released Wang on May 3, 2011, over 48 hours after taking her into custody.
