## Short Summary

According to AP ([10 April 11](#), via Yahoo!) and CFP ([13 April 11](#)), on April 10, 2011, public security officials in Haidian district, Beijing city, took into custody pastor [Li Xiaobai](#) of the unregistered Beijing Shouwang Church and his wife Lu Bingxia after they led an April 10 outdoor worship gathering in Haidian organized by Shouwang. Officials reportedly held them at a police station in Beijing and released them on April 12. Li was released into a state of home confinement; sources do not indicate if Lu was placed under home confinement. According to Shouwang ([27 March 11](#), via CAA), authorities previously pressured its landlords to deny it access to indoor sites of worship where it had met or planned to meet. On April 10, Shouwang began to organize outdoor worship gatherings on successive Sundays in Haidian district, Beijing. According to CAA ([17 April 11](#), in English), public security officials in Beijing took Li and Lu into custody again on April 16—one day before one of the gatherings—but released them after a few hours. According to Shouwang ([29 April 11](#), via CAA), Li remained confined to his home as of April 29. Sources do not provide further information on Lu's status.
